

Social responsibility in operations that are certified according to Bio Suisse standards

Background information

Bio Suisse actively advocates social responsibility in organic production. This topic is also very important to producers and consumers of organic products, and social responsibility has always been a guiding principle of the organic farming sector.

Bio Suisse requires a social certificate/audit according to Bio Suisse Standards from farming operations in France, Italy, Morocco, Peru, Portugal and Spain that have more than four employees and produce vegetables, fruit or herbs. The same requirement applies to banana producers from all countries of origin, as well as to hazelnut producers from Turkey.

Farming operations in the following countries that produce the products listed must provide proof of social responsibility certification/auditing:

*Producer groups that have been certified by GlobalG.A.P. are subject to GRASP audits in compliance with GlobalG.A.P. regulations.

Exceptions

- Operations with less than 5 employees are exempted from this obligation unless worker representation is possible through the group, like with GRASP for GlobalG.A.P. Option 2.
- Operations that already have social responsibility certification according to Naturland, Ecovalia or Valore Social standards do not need any other kind of social responsibility auditing.
- Operations that are not or cannot be GlobalG.A.P. certified can apply for a derogation.
- Hazelnuts from Turkey: Bio Suisse can grant temporary derogations for social responsibility standards that do not fully meet ILO norms.

Confirmation by means of a Bio Suisse 'Social responsibility' self-declaration form

Operations that have employees, that do not fall under the external social responsibility certification/auditing obligation (as per section 3.3.8.1), and that have 20 or more employees must fill out and sign a self-declaration form (checklist) supplied by Bio Suisse.

Operations which meet one of the following criteria and which possess a valid document (certificate/audit report no older than 18 months) need not fill out the Bio Suisse 'Social responsibility' self-declaration form:

Advance notice

Over approximately the next five years a social audit will be incorporated directly into the Bio Suisse inspection. The social audit will be introduced in stages, and the operations affected will be notified well in advance concerning the changes. Once the social audit has been regularly incorporated into the Bio Suisse inspection, it will replace both the requirement for external social certification or social auditing as well as the self-declaration form.
